






"Try and leave this world a little better than you found it"

PRACTICAL INFORMATION FOR YOUR TRAVEL TO KISC

High up in the mountains, Kandersteg can be found in the Jungfrau-Aletsch region of the Swiss Alps, about 65km from Bern, or a 1 hour train journey away. You can reach us by plane, train or car and the local bus from the station is free, if you wear your scarf! If you're walking from the station, we're about 20 minutes away at the end of the valley on the northern side of the Lötschberg tunnel.

About Kandersteg

A traditional Alpine village in the heart of the Bernese Oberland, a UNESCO World Heritage site. Surrounded by stunning mountains, epic waterfalls and beautiful nature, Kandersteg also has lots of shops and services to make your stay more comfortable.

Including: restaurants, hotels, grocery stores, a doctors practice, banks, cash machines, a Catholic and Protestant Church and a garage.

WEATHER DURING JULY/AUGUST 2023



Temperature

Kander 100 will take place in the middle of the swiss summer, between the months of July and August. During the Jamboree, we can expect temperatures between 6°C (42.8°F) at night and 24.5°C (76.1°F) at midday. However, it is very important to note that during the summer of 2022, there was an extraordinary heatwave in the area, making the temperatures pass 30°C (86°F) some days.

Rains

During a normal summer, we can expect around 16 days of rain per month in July and August, with a total average of 335.00 mm per month. The humidity is around 79%.

Recommendations

The weather in the valley and in the mountains tends to change quickly, so you have to be ready for everything. We strongly recommend that you bring:

- Rucksack 20 to 40 litres
- Hiking boots with ankle support (no trainers)
- Waterproof jacket and waterproof trousers
- Warm clothing long trousers, fleece, warm hat and gloves (no jeans)
- Sun protection sun cream, sunglasses, sun hat
- Water bottle 2 litres
- Personal medication (asthma inhalers, etc.)



COVID-19 SITUATION



At KISC, we follow the swiss national health guidelines to tackle the covid pandemic.

At the moment of this Bulletin publication, the National Authorities do not have any mandatory requirements for entering or traveling in the country. However, we strongly recommend all participants to be fully vaccinated against COVID-19 according to their National Health Authorities.

ACCOMMODATION TYPE

Camping:

This type of accommodation requires you to bring tents and any other needed equipment for camping. You can rent camping equipment and tents at the center but we have a very limited number.

Indoor accommodation:

This includes staying at one of our buildings (shared rooms): Old Chalet, Sunneblick, Tower, Cevihaus or Schweizerhaus. This will be based on the most suitable allocations by our staff. You will be provided by bedding sheets and you are expected to keep the cleanliness of your allocated space.

Kanderlodge:

The Kanderlodge is our building with more upscale accommodation. Each two rooms share their own private bathroom. There is also a fully equipped kitchen and dining area as a common area to use for all participants staying in the building.

FOOD SERVICES



Full-Board:

The Full Board booking package includes all meals from the Centre, starting with Dinner on 27th July 2023 and ending with Lunch on 8th August 2023. The meal times are binding. This needs to be taken into account for any meals on arrival/departure days and any lateness to one of the meals needs to be announced to KISC staff in advance.

Food supply:

The Food Supply package includes ingredients and recipes for groups to cook their own food. Groups staying in indoor accommodation or the Kanderlodge, will have access to shared cooking facilities (it might be shared with other groups). Cooking utensils are not included for groups on the Campsite but can be rented from the Centre, free of charge, (limited availability, countries outside of Europe will be prioritized).

Self-Catering:

The Self-Catering package does not include cooking utensils. Groups staying in indoor accommodation or the Kanderlodge, will have access to shared cooking facilities (it might be shared with other groups). Cooking utensils are not included for groups on the Campsite but can be rented from the Centre at an additional charge (limited availability, Groups/Contingents traveling furthest will be prioritized).

Rentals:

In case you want any rental equipment for camping or cooking, you can submit a request through the group inquiries form (you can find it below). Once the form is closed all rental equipment will be allocated to groups.

^{*}Rental allocations will be prioritized for those coming from a further distance. This is not included in the participation fees.

KANDER 100 REGISTRATION & FEES



The registration is now closed but in the interest of diversity, we are allowing some specific countries to be included in the event. If you're a member of a country that hasn't already registered, you can make a request. Check the list at https://2023.kisc.ch/ events/Kander 100/ to see if you qualify. If you are not a member of a country listed below, you will be placed on a waiting list and we will get back to you as soon as we have a space.

NSO World Scout Event Participation fee category by country Kander 100 fee system follows the "NSO World Scout Event participation fee category by country". This means if you are a member of an NSO from a category A, B or C country, you can get a discount of up to 75% on your accommodation. To find out which category your country/NSO belongs to, check out NSO World Scout Event participation fee category by country **World Scouting**

Regardless of your selection of accommodation and Food Services, all fees include the following:

- One day hiking
- One day of Alpine Experience
- All on-site activities
- The three main ceremonies
- Registration kit: Kander 100 scarf, badge and ID card.

In case of selecting Food-supply: Cooking sets (limited availability). Countries further away will be prioritized.



Registration fees

You can check your preferred fees* based on your choice of food and accommodation, according to your country category, through **Annex 1** below.

* All prices are in Swiss Francs (CHF) and include tourist tax.

Payment and installment

If you have submitted a request in the <u>waiting list form of Kander 100</u> and you received an answer from our staff, you must follow our payment process as mentioned below. The payment must be in Swiss francs.

PROGRAMME



On-Site Programme

The On-site activities programme includes all the workshops, educational spaces, activities and games that are located either at KISC or in the village of Kandersteg and near its surroundings. As well as the Off-site Programme, the On-site programme is the heart of the event, and is designed to challenge every participant in the different areas of development, aiming to connect with the Global Challenges and Youth trends. This experience will be remembered by every scout for their entire life.



Challenge Activities

Does zip-wiring, crate stacking or water sports excite you? If so, the Kander 100 Challenge Activities Area is the place for you. Challenge yourself and face your fears in a safe and fun environment with the challenge activities! Join us in the different activities inside and outside KISC.

All of our activities are suitable for any skill set (beginner to expert). At each activity, you will receive safety instructions and all of the help you need to start having fun right away. Adventure awaits!

Global Goals Exhibition

The Global Goals Exhibition is an all-in-one dynamic place to discover how Scouts are creating positive change around the world with local projects and international networks, through fun and engaging activities.

The Exhibition welcomes all groups and individuals to explore the United Nations Global Goals. This is an opportunity to involve young people in the global development agenda and empower them with the knowledge, attitudes and skills needed to play an active role in their communities to make it stronger and more sustainable.

The universal, transformational and inclusive Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) describe major development challenges for humanity. The aim of the 17 SDGs is to secure a sustainable, peaceful, prosperous and equitable life on Earth for everyone now and in the future. The Exhibition will be split into 5 spaces: People, Prosperity, Peace, Planet and Partnerships.

You will also get to learn about the World Organization of the Scout Movement's (WOSM) key world initiatives and programs such as the Environment and Sustainability (Earth Tribe), Peace and Community Engagement (Messengers of Peace), Health and Well-being and Life Skills. You will also get information about the other KISC Centenary event, and join the live stream with the World Scout Jamboree. You can even learn how to become a staff member (a pinkie!). Make sure you do not miss out on our many special Night Events for rovers and adult leaders.



Village Activities

When Baden Powell came across Kandersteg, he began to build his dream of a permanent Jamboree. This amazing village is full of activities that you can take part in during your stay in Kander 100, explore the history of Kandersteg and KISC at the local museum, swim in the pool or visit the World Heritage site in the village..

The village has multiple restaurants that offer multiple international cuisines, cable cars that can take you to different mountains and an opportunity to view the village from the top. The village can be reached by bus, which is free when you are wearing your scarf. Or you can take a more scenic walk into the village.

Pop-up Activities

Do you want to learn exciting skills and play games from all over the globe? Well, keep an eye during the event because the pop-up activities are everywhere!

Our Pinkies are the life of KISC, coming from many backgrounds and with a lot of different stories. The Pinkies that run KISC every year are eager to show you their favourite games from all over the world: from teaching you how to play the amazing new KISC board games to being referees in the sports WorldCup, the Pop-up activities are fun, easy to learn activities that can occur every day anywhere in the village of Kandersteg and aim to gather scouts from different groups and countries.

The Pop-up activities focus on teamwork, and social and personal leadership development. They will be located around the village and the centre, with a duration of two or three hours.





Spiritual development area

The Spiritual Development Area will emphasize the connective nature of spirituality to bring people together. The area will tap into this essential spirit of Kander 100 by encouraging scouts to discover a myriad of worldviews different from their own, discovering both commonalities and new perspectives.

In this area, participants will learn from a diverse arrange of activities and ceremonies, including WOSM initiative, Dialogue for Peace, where young and adults can develop their dialogue skills, spread the message of peace through their acts, learn about conflict management and create a safe space for Dialogue for everyone.

Scouts will be able to explore how they can develop their spirituality, and understand the sense of shared values that connects us all. Hear about different faiths and beliefs around the world, shape their values and express their ideas with others. One of the amazing activities will be meditation sessions, so don't forget to join us during Kander 100!



Social Programme areas

Social programmes will be happening all around the campsite for both youth participants and adults from different countries and backgrounds. Each evening, once you have spent the day making amazing memories, you can carry on making friends, trade badges and even perform live. It will be a great way to meet up with your new friends from the day and build more. There will be exhibitions and performances, music and lots of activities including interactive workshops to enjoy.

The Adults Social Area will be an area to relax after a long day, enjoy some time off and meet other contingent/group leaders. The area will have a cafe, offering drinks and snacks.

Workshops

As scouts, we are lifelong learners especially when on camp. In our workshop space, you will learn how to tackle local issues at home, and get aware of the global challenges.

In this area, scouts can join meetings and educational sessions designed to provide an awareness of global challenges, such as climate change and peace dialogue. These workshops are divided into two different groups:

Global challenge workshops: Youth and adults are invited to share and identify issues in the world today, collaborating together to design a strategic plan to face them. The focus of these workshops is to encourage open discussions and form respectful debates.

Life skills workshops: These workshops aim to teach different subjects and skills in a practical way, with a focus on scouting-related skills, as well as opportunities to expand your skills in other topics.





Off-Site Programme

The incredible Alps have been astonishing for many years, now it is your turn to wander across its peaks and valleys. The off-site programme is part of the core of the program area of Kander 100 and seeks to give the opportunity to each participant to experience the surroundings and marvel at the diverse nature of the Swiss alpine environment.



Hiking

What does it take to hike long distances in the Swiss alps? Spend your day enjoying the beauty of nature surrounding KISC. Each hike traverses through different environments: from the neat village of Kandersteg to the high peaks of Bunderspitz and Lötchsenpass. Are you ready to tackle the challenge? Every group will have a "Hike day", so choose the most suitable hike for your level of experience (easy, medium, hard) and be prepared for a truly magical adventure in the Swiss Alps. All the hikes are run by our experienced hiking guide team, they will ensure your safety from start to finish, whilst ensuring you have a memorable experience.



Alpine Experience

KISC bases its magic on the environment where it is founded: the Swiss Alps. Do you want to experience that magic yourself? Then join our Alpine experience.

Rock climbing, bouldering, mountain biking, and many more. There are different activities for all abilities, so everyone can enjoy the majestic Alps. Each activity is supervised by a staff member that will make sure to explain the safety rules to everyone at every moment, and will encourage every participant to be part of the experience.

External activities and Hut Experience (with additional cost)

Hut Experience

Have you ever thought about how it would be to live in the middle of the Alps? Well, wonder no more, because now it is time to experience it! Spend one night in one of many different huts built high up in the lost mountains of the Berner Oberland, and be amazed by a night full of stars, the sounds of the wild animals, and the beauty of the green pastures.

> The hut experience is not included in the Kander 100 main programme package and has to be booked in advance at an additional cost.



External activities

During Kander 100, the included programme offers a wide range of activities that will suit every scout and encourage them to develop new skills and step out of their comfort zone. However, we are also proud to have a partnership with many third-partyrun outdoor activities that match our vision and mission. You can choose from a wide range of activities to do: from Paragliding to river rafting, canyoning to sky diving, or why not take a train to another city to discover the local history.

All external activities are not included in the main Kander 100 registration fees and need to be booked in advance by the group with additional costs.

External Activities and Hut Experience bookings start on the 1st of March, 2023. A reminder with more information on how to submit a request will be sent by February 2023 through the Bulletin #2 of Kander 100.

Service Project

During Kander 100, we want the participants to leave a mark on the event as much as the event will leave a mark on them. Community engagement allows Scouts to experience and work with people from different diversities.

Community involvement promotes greater cohesion and rallies each member of the community towards a common purpose of transforming their communities for the better.

After all of the projects have been received, we will decide four projects to work on during the event, and will contact the project designers to make their idea a reality during the two weeks of Kander 100.

We aim to complete the four projects in time, making a real and tangible impact in KISC and Kandersteg.  - MEDIUM: Medium physical difficulty
 - HARD: Difficult and Very Difficult physical difficulty
- Camping rental expression of interest
- Cooking sets rental expression of interest

To complete the form you will need:

- Booking number from your Group/Contingent.
- Preference of the type of Hiking and Alpine Experience for your group.
- Express interest in renting any kind of equipment for camping/ cooking.
